Dear parents and carers,

Each child will have more races and as it will be less crowded on the day, parents will be able to see their child's race more easily and get photos easier too. We do appreciate that for some families this means slightly more time off work, but we hope the advanced notice and the improved event will make it worthwhile. More details will follow prior to sports day but you can look forward to long distance, sprints, relay and novelty races.

Finally, on a sad note, Ms Bennett has broken her arm but is recovering well. I know all of you will join me in wishing her a speedy recovery. Ms Bennett is signed off work for a few more weeks so anything urgent, please come and see myself or the class teacher.


