School trips and PE Kits.

I am increasingly worried about the amount of time staff are spending chasing permission slips for school trips. Office staff have also spent a considerable amount of time making sure trips have been paid for and this is not an effective use of their time. Had it not been for the hard work of the office team, recent school trips were in danger of being cancelled due to non-payment and lack of permission slips being signed. Obviously we do not want this to happen so we all need to make an effort.

From September, trips are going to be communicated through a letter with a permission slip to sign and return. This will be a hard, paper copy. Ping will still be used for updates and messages. The letter for trips will also have space for medical information, contact details and whether a packed lunch is required. This letter is going to be sent out even earlier than we currently do prior to a trip so we all have plenty of time to return and collate information. The trips we run are integral to our curriculum and the learning that the children get from these is amazing. Our recent OFSTED inspection commented on how much the children enjoy and benefit from the trips so it is vital we all improve this aspect of organising and running them.

The number of children in KS2 who are 'forgetting' PE kit is also a concern. PE is part of the national curriculum and children should only miss a lesson for exceptional circumstances. We know that when children enter secondary school, sanctions are used when children forget kit, such as detentions. We need to get children into good habits of remembering kit as it is incredibly difficult for teachers to find spare items. We are now going to log and record children who miss a session of PE due to not having kit and if it occurs more than once, a letter will be sent home to make parents aware of the situation.
