SENCO- new in post. Tracking pupils. Building relationships with families and pupils may be challenging given Covid procedures. However, maths catch- up provision is going to be implemented and tracked as it is the subject where more pupils have regressed. Maths baseline ages are being completed.

In line with DfE recommendations with regards to Mental Health and Wellbeing provision in schools document (October 2018), Play Therapy & Pastoral Support Manager to continue to support vulnerable pupils.

Thrive Approach rolled out across school used to support and monitor vulnerable pupils emotional development. SCARF to be further promoted through on- line access to workshops for each year group and as a scheme of work for PSHE (based on last year as cycle not completed).

Continue to promote high attendance as part of a positive work ethos across the school.

Ensure that there is provision for PPG/ most vulnerable pupils to access remote learning if required.
